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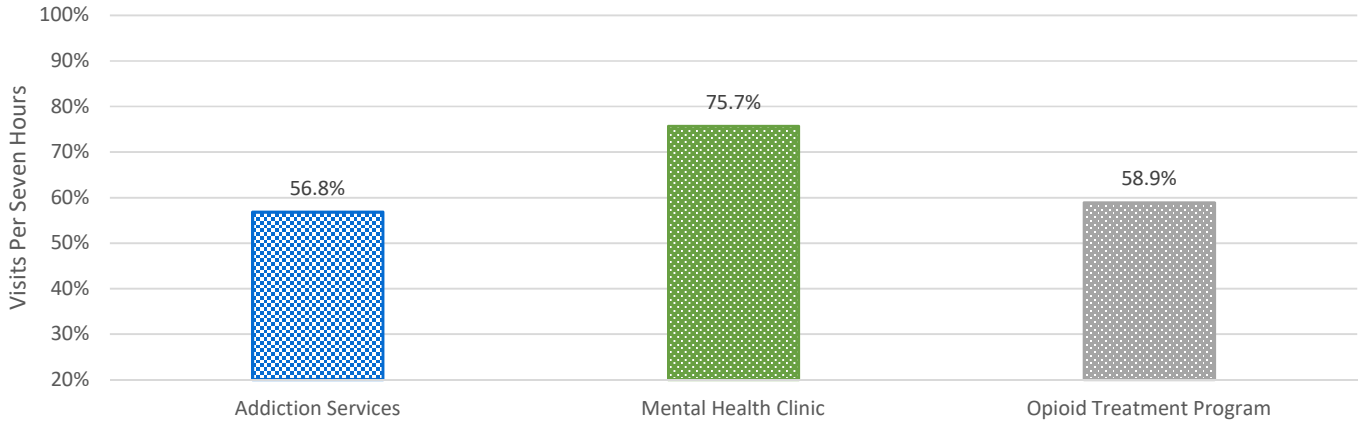

Monthly Clinic Counselor Visits Average

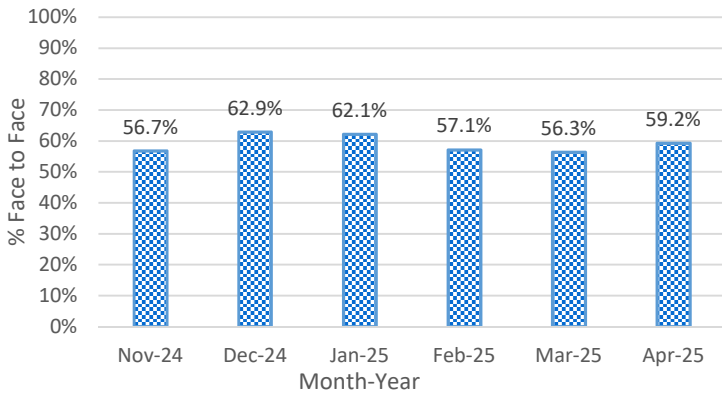
Average of Clinics: 62%

6 Month Average of Clinics: 63%



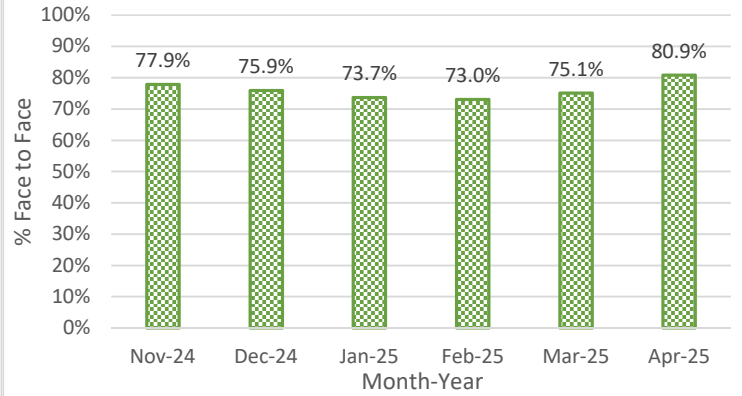
Addiction Services/OTP Face to Face %

Average 59%



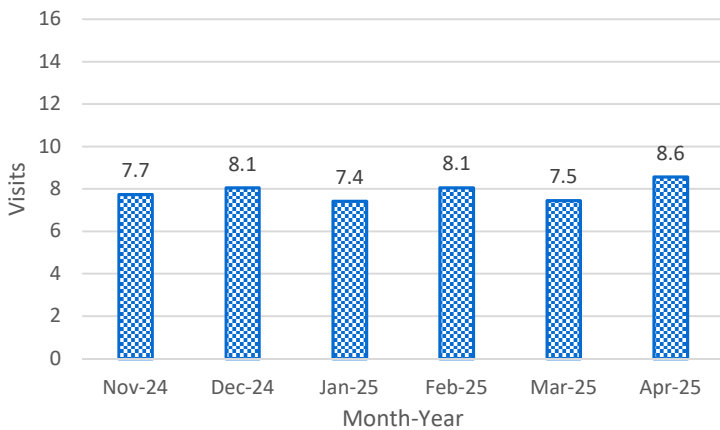
Mental Health Face to Face %

Average 76%



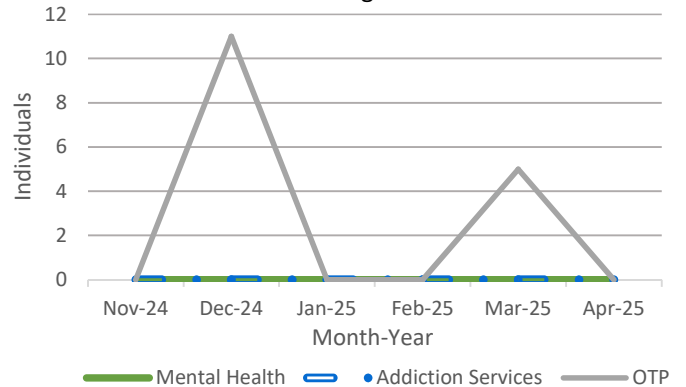
Prescriber Visits Per Seven Hours

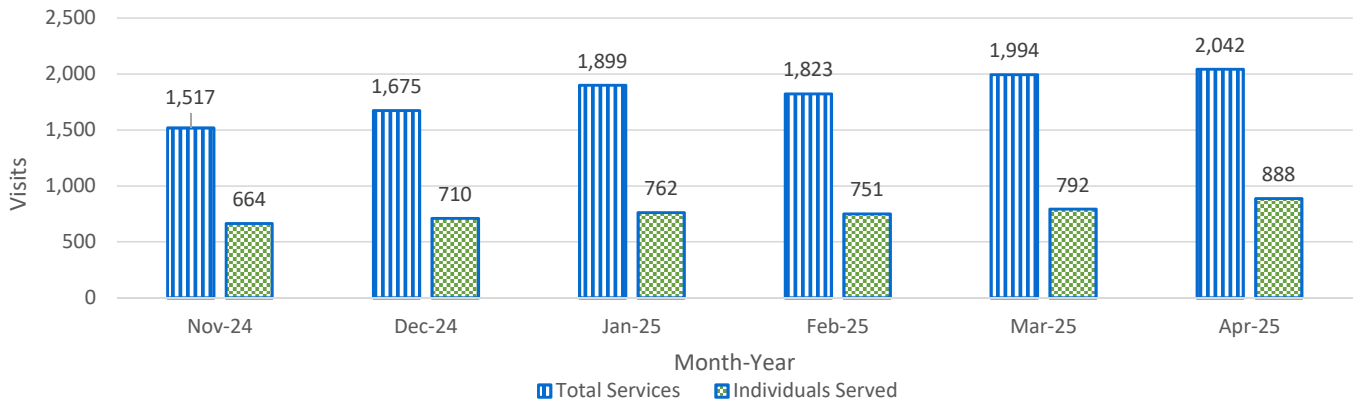

Services Provided - All Clinics

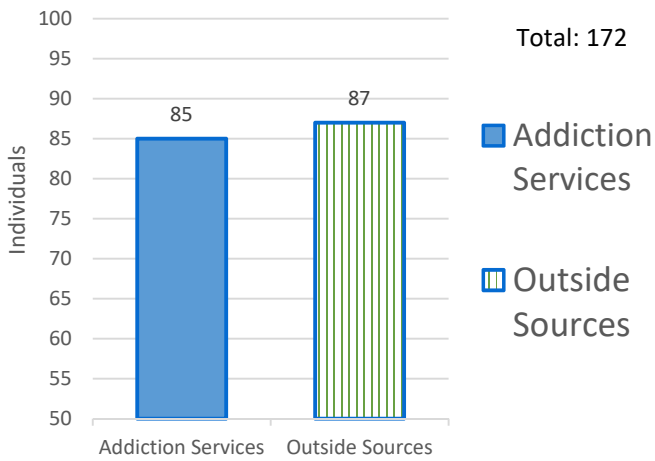

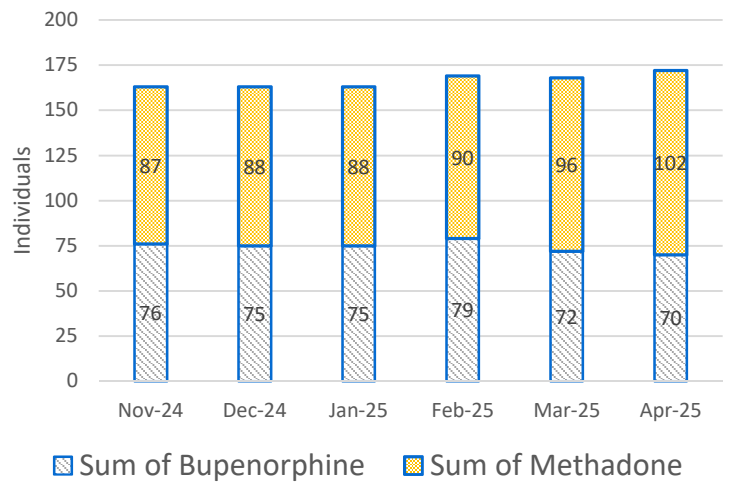

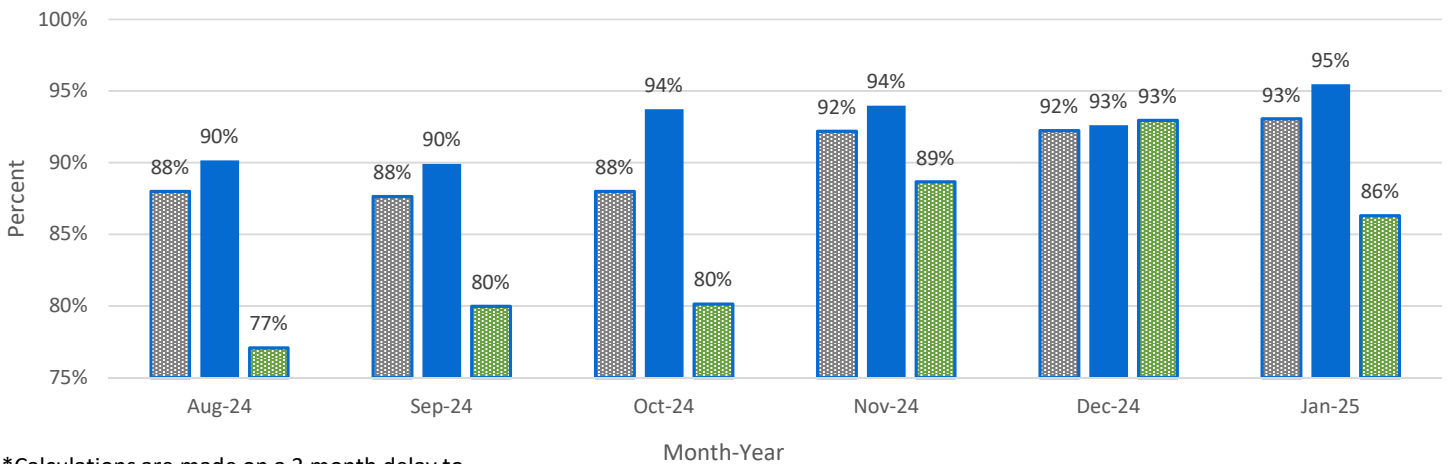
Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) Population Source

Reimbursement Rate by Clinic



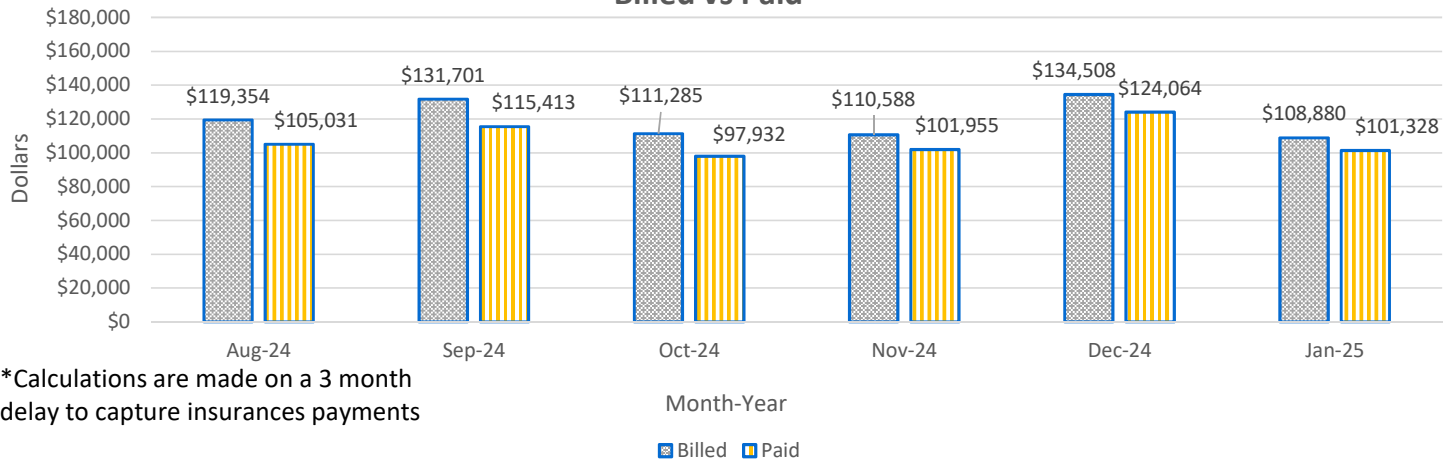

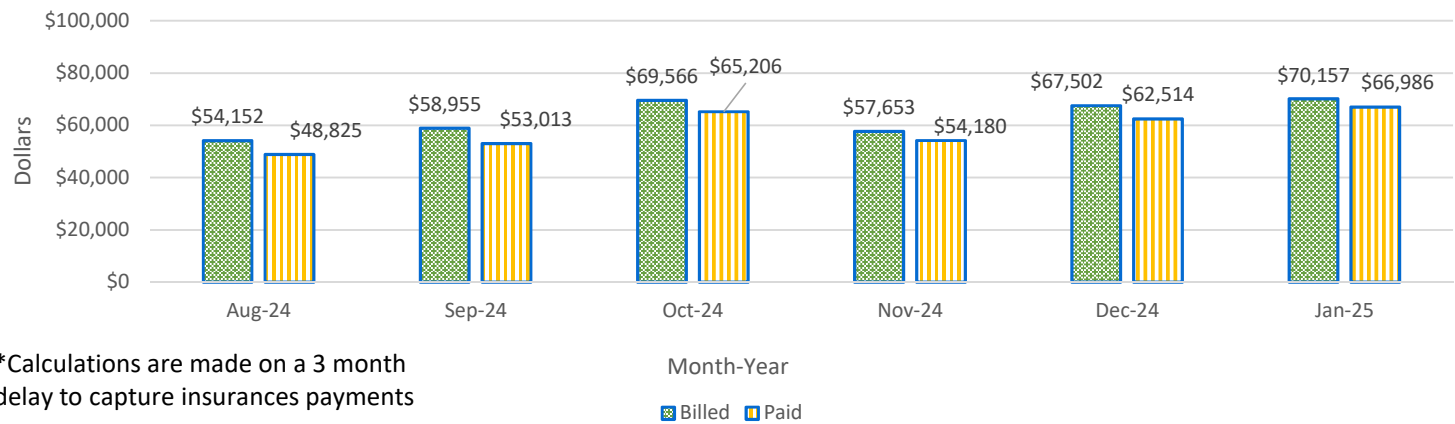
Opioid Treatment Program Billed vs Paid

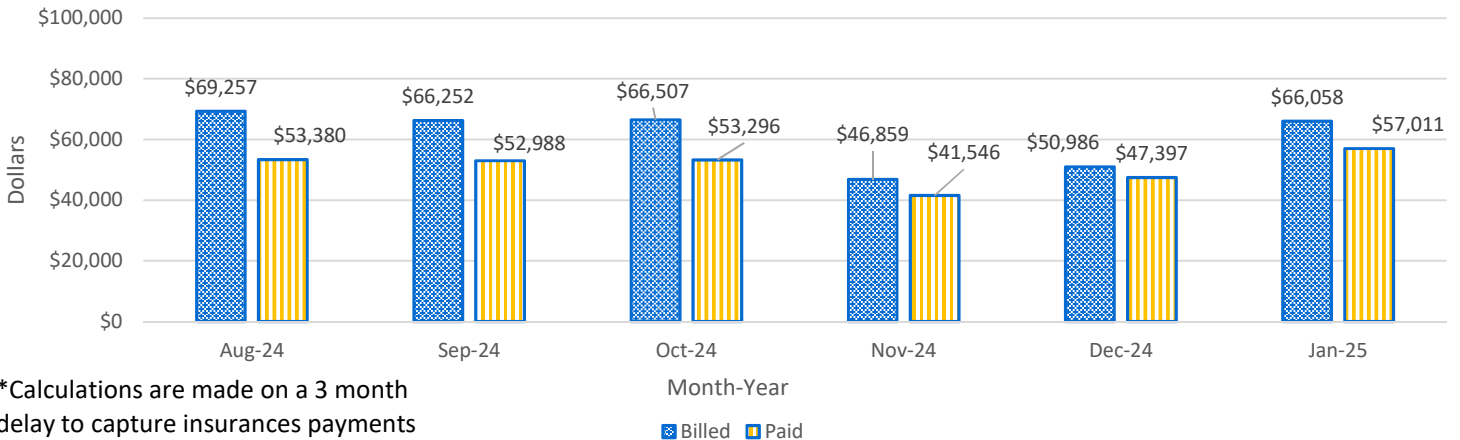
Mental Health Billed vs Paid

Addiction Services Billed vs Paid

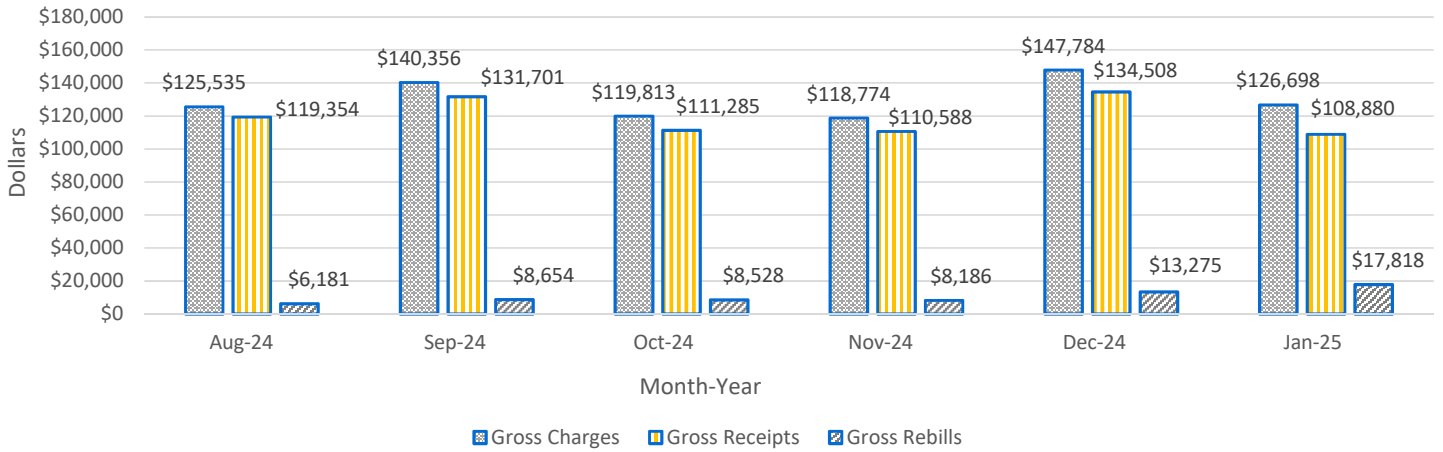

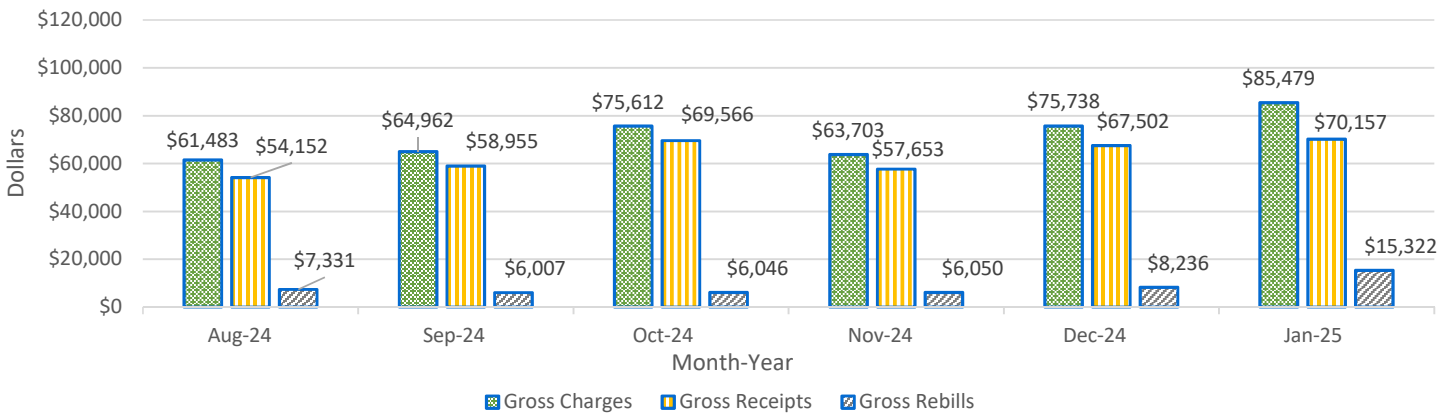

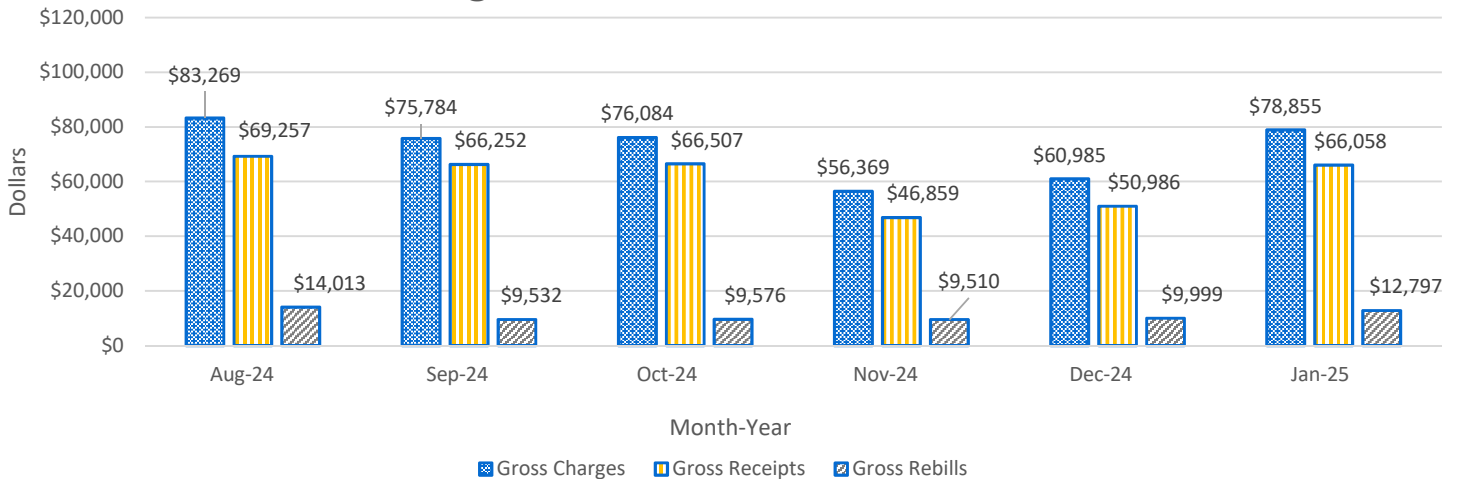
Opioid Treatment Program Charges, Reimbursements, vs Rebills

**AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO SIGN AN INTENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH COMMUNITY ACCESSIBILITY
AND INCLUSION (CAI) FOR THE CHILDREN AND YOUTH WITH SPECIAL
HEALTH CARE NEEDS PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs Program (CYSHCN) provides resources and referrals for children and their families in the community to ensure access to healthcare, insurance, information, and support services, and

WHEREAS, as a participant in the Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs Program for the 2025-2030 funding cycle, the Public Health Department is eligible for additional one-time funding under the newly developed Community Accessibility and Inclusion (CAI) for the CYSHCN Program, and

WHEREAS, funding is only available for year one (1) of five (5) (10/01/2025 – 9/30/2026) for the CAI aspect of the CYSHCN Program, and the Public Health Department will receive a projected one-time award amount of \$37,832 (PE044895 57000 CSHN), or more as additional funds may become available,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to sign an Intent to Participate with the New York State Department of Health Community Accessibility and Inclusion (CAI) for the Children and Youth with Special Healthcare Needs Program, upon approval of the County Attorney.

**AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND THE NEW YORK STATE
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE 340B DRUG PRICING
PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the 340B Drug Pricing Program is a federal program that enables eligible healthcare organizations to purchase outpatient drugs at significantly reduced prices, thereby enhancing the ability of such organizations to provide comprehensive healthcare services to underserved populations, and

WHEREAS, to participate in the 340B Program, eligible organizations/covered entities must register and be enrolled with the 340B Program and comply with all 340B Program requirements, and

WHEREAS, once enrolled, covered entities are assigned a 340B identification number that vendors verify before allowing an organization to purchase 340B discounted drugs, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Health requires a Memorandum of Understanding for continued participation in the 340B Program to reduce the incidence of sexually transmitted infections and their sequelae,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the Public Health Department and the New York State Department of Health for participation in the 340B Drug Pricing Program, upon approval of the County Attorney.

**MODIFYING THE 2025 BUDGET FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES
FOR THE CHILD CARE BLOCK GRANT**

WHEREAS, the New York State Child Care Block Grant (NYSCCBG) Child Care Assistance Program informed the Department of Social Services that their FFY 2025 allocation amount for the period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025, and

WHEREAS, any portion of a Local Department of Social Services (LDSS) NYSCCBG allocation for FFY 2024, October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024 that is not claimed by the LDSS by March 31, 2025, will remain available to the LDSS through the end of the FFY 2025 (September 30, 2025), and

WHEREAS, the appropriations and revenue are going to be higher than anticipated for 2025,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Treasurer to modify the 2025 Budget for the Department of Social Services for the Child Care Block Grant as follows:

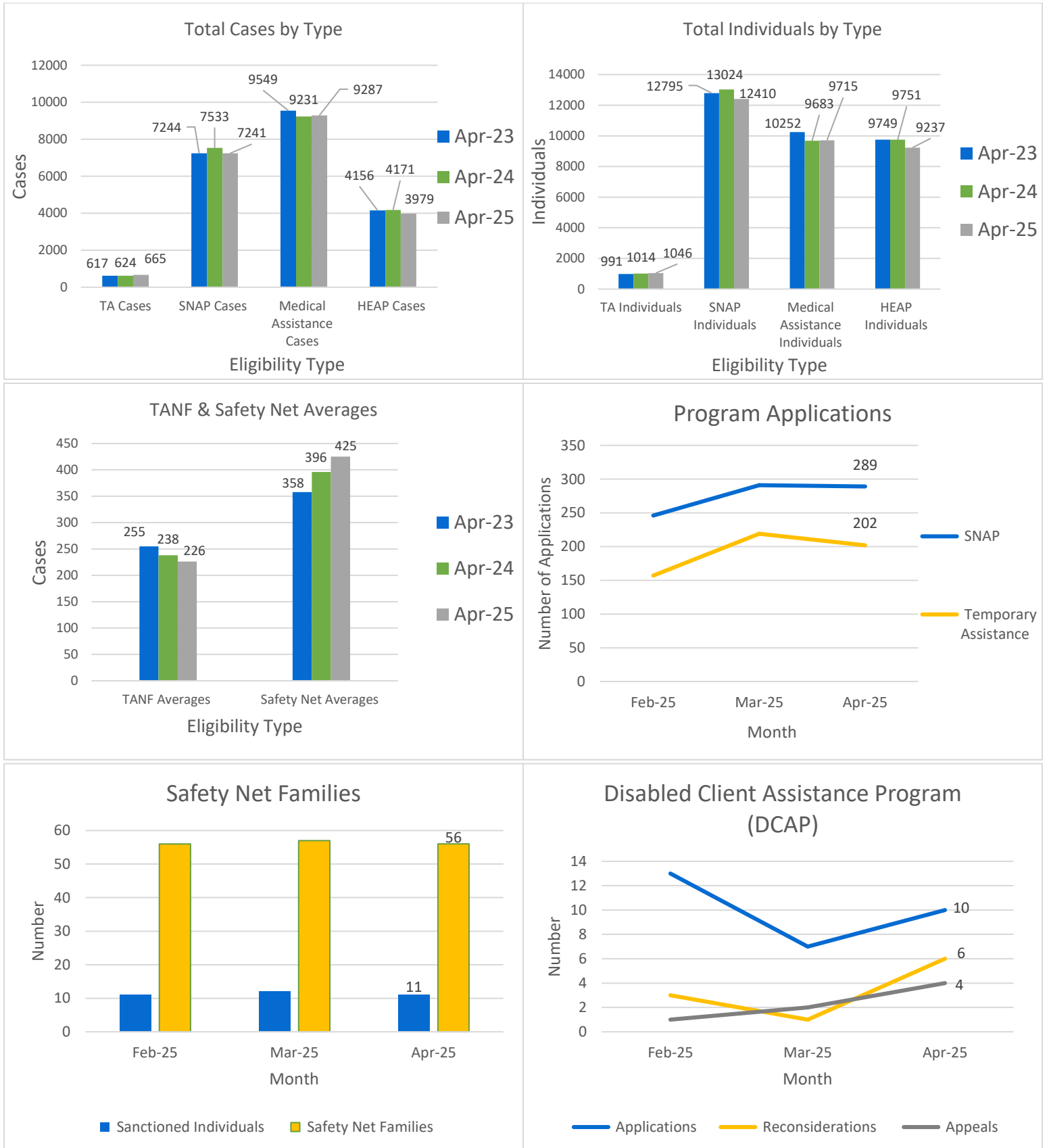

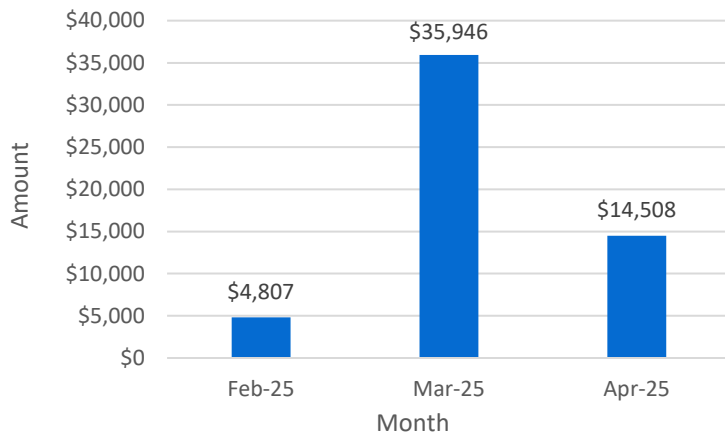

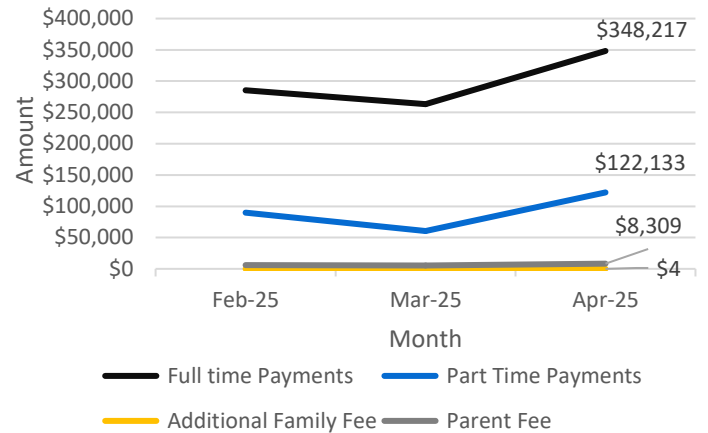
Eligibility Programs



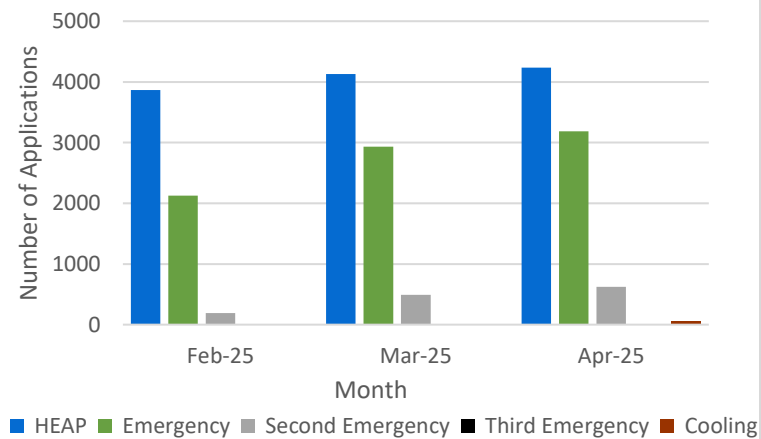
DCAP Interim Assistance Reimbursed



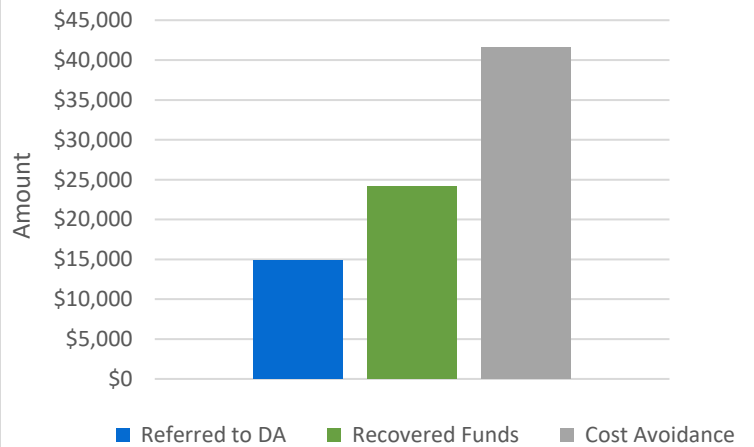
Child Care Assistance Payments 151 Providers



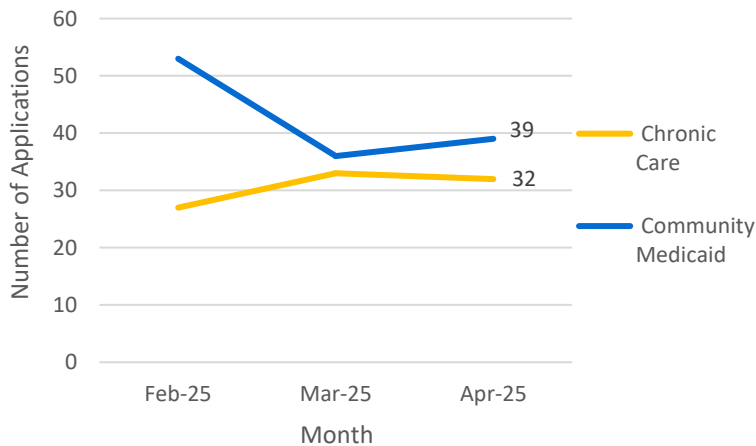
Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)



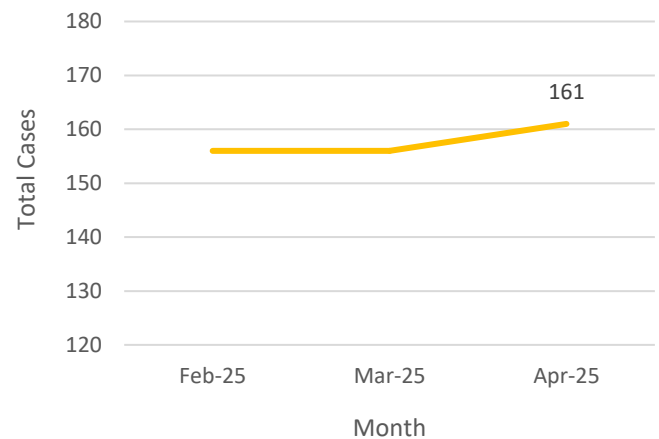
Fraud Investigation Unit (YTD)



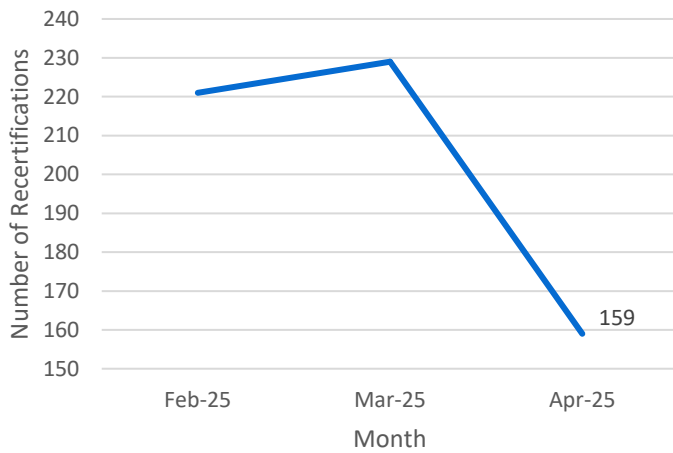
Medicaid Applications



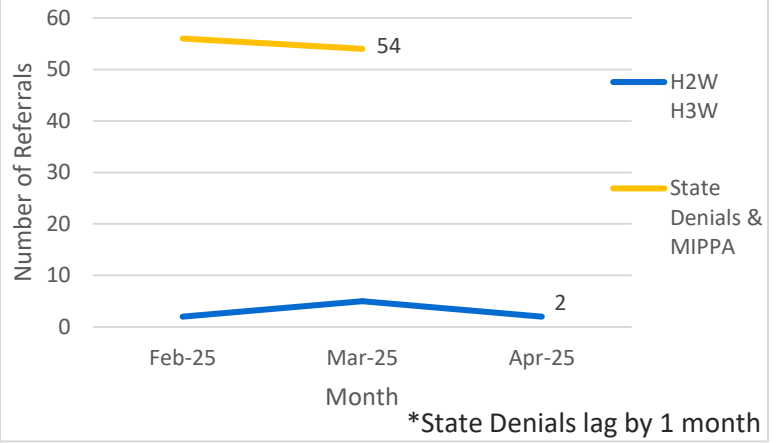
Medical Services Unit Cases

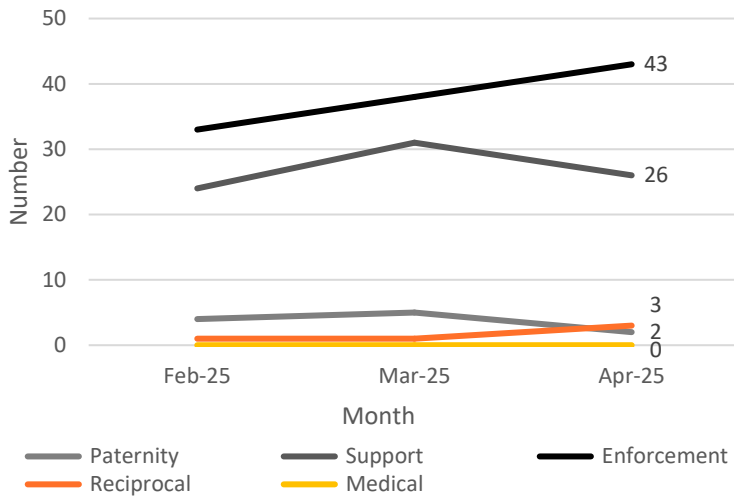
